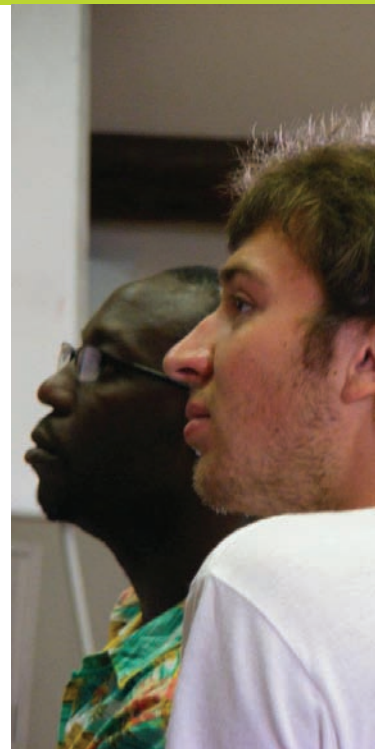
International Summer University
